

Materials:

Blanket size 6 weight yarn: Cream, Grey or brown (I used Bernat O'Go Blanket yarn in Hibernate (both colors are on the round) 5 mm hook 12mm safety nose Fiber fill Needle/Scissors Hook or clip to make the keychain

Terms:

Stitch – ST Chain - CH Single Crochet – SC Half Double Crochet - HDC Slip Stitch – SL ST Skip Stitch – SK ST Single Crochet 2 stitches together – SC2TOG (An invisible decrease stitch makes these look nice and smooth) Half Double Crochet Foundation Stitch - HDCFS Great Tutorial if this is unfamiliar: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=I9Og5cd2L0o</u> Between * * repeat this many **additional** times "x" End of row (Parenthesis) total number of stitches in row Magic Circle – MC Great tutorial for MC: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=p298HxgsO1s</u>

Note: when changing colors work ends into stitches as you go along. This allows for less end weaving at the end of project. Also, when changing colors, always finish previous stitch with new color this makes for a smoother color change.

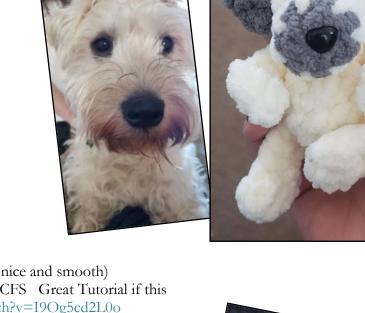
Big Note: I'm left-handed; all pictures are shown with left handed progress unless otherwise stated. Pattern works for both left and right-handed crafters.

Another Note: be sure to use a stitch marker to mark the beginning stitch of each round to keep your place. It is very important to keep track of every round.

When working in rounds do not sl st at end of round or chain 1 unless stated.

Head/body:

With Cream. You'll make a peanut shape working from bottom to top

- 1 sc 6 in mc. Pull tight. (6)
- 2-2sc in each stitch around (12)
- 3-4 sc all the way around (12)
- 5 *sc, sc, sc2tog* repeat 2x (9) Stuff with Fiber fill
- 6 sc, sc, sc2tog, sc, sc, sc2tog, sc, sc (7)
- 7 *2sc* repeat 4x, sc, sc (12)
- 8 sc all the way around (12)
- 9 *sc2tog* repeat 5x (6) Stuff with Fiber fill

Leaving a long tail, cut and pull yarn through last stitch, thread with needle, push needle through front loops only of the 6 remaining stitches all the way around. Pull tight closing the body. Weave through securing closed.



Nose:

With Grey/Brown 1 – sc 6 in mc. Pull tight. (6) Change color to cream 2 – sc all the way around (6) Slip st to join

Tie off, leave length for sewing to center of face.

Place 12 mm safety nose in the center of the magic circle. Sew nose to the top (smaller) portion of body/head.

Legs and Arms:

Back legs: With Cream, Starting with a 6" length HDCFS 4,

In the space between stitches at the end of the chain put 5 hdc, chain 1, cut 4" length and pull through stitch. Weave in this end and use the first end to sew to the bottom side of body.

Arms: With Cream, Starting with a 6" length HDCFS 3,

In the space between stitches at the end of the chain put 5 hdc, chain 1 cut, and pull through stitch. Weave in this end and use the first end to sew to the sides of body.



Tail:

With cream: Weave a strand 9" long through a stich and the back end (bottom) of puppy. Make 3 knots (classic: one over and under pull tight) with the ends and pull tight. Weave both ends back into body. This should make a cute little stubby tail. If you'd like a longer tail, make more knots. Until desired length.

Ears: Make 2 -You'll make 2 triangles With grey or brown Starting with a 6" length HDCFS 2, Ch 1, tie off leaving at leas 6" for sewing. Sew starting length to the top edge near center of head on the side. Weave in end. Now, use the finishing end to sew the bottom of ear to the side of the head. This will make a kindof cup/scoop of the triangle. Weave in end.

With Cream, and another small length, sew key chain hook to the top of head.

The Wheaten Greetin' PDF Crochet Pattern is great for gifts and is an easy project for beginner to intermediate crocheter.

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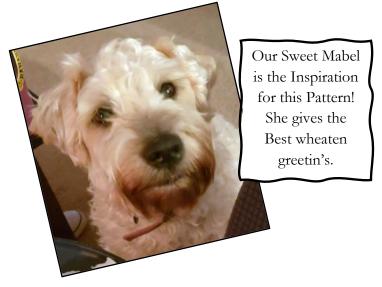
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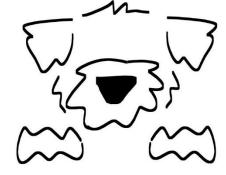
